Harvest time has come around again after another challenging year of weather for our farmers. We are seeing the terrible consequences of climate change with fires and floods, earthquake and famine rocking our world and destroying lives and livelihoods. How can we make a difference?

St Francis believed that there is an interconnectedness of all creation; that we must treat every creature as sister or brother.

Now the Sacred Trails group are working on a new project: ‘

Fragile Earth – our Sacred Space’

With this and the schools’ RE curriculum in mind, we propose a programme during the next academic year to give children and adults tools and insights into a Christian response that builds confidence, agency and hope as we engage with the challenges of a changing climate in a changing world.

We plan to visit our deanery schools and with the help of a Godly Play story to consider the wonders of Creation and to all that is good and precious in God’s beautiful world. Our human interference and pollution are leading to worldwide concerns so we want to concentrate on what we as individuals can do to transform our growing anxieties into hope-filled actions, great and small. We will be asking the children to respond creatively to the story and together create a ‘Cloth of Dreams’, a patchwork of their own dreams and wishes for the future of our fragile planet. We plan a final event at Simonburn to coincide with ‘The Great Big Green Week’ in June 2024.

We will be looking for faithful volunteers, old and new, to help us, and for Seamstresses or broderers to work with the fabric to create the ‘Cloths’.
